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Marmon Aerospace & Defense Name History

This is a brief history of Marmon Aerospace & Defense, LLC and how the current name came to be used.

1996 - Delta Surprenant sells to Rockbestos Corp.

1997 – The two companies are officially merged as Rockbestos-Surprenant Cable Corp.

1998 – Rockbestos-Surprenant Cable Corp. purchases PMC Wire, a thermocouple cable manufacturer located in Manchester, NH

2003 – Aerospace Products, M81044, M22759 & M27500 are moved to PMC Wire

2008 - Rockbestos-Surprenant Cable Corp. name is changed to RSCC Wire & Cable, LLC (now over 90 years cable manufacturing history a Marmon/Berkshire Hathaway Company)

2009 – PMC (thermocouple products moved to TE Wire, also a Marmon Company)

2009 - Shipboard and Military Vehicle cable production is moved from RSCC Wire & Cable, LLC in East Granby, CT to Manchester, NH joining the original RSCC Aerospace products. This alignment, along with the shift out of thermocouple products, makes Manchester, NH facility a focused Military and Aerospace manufacturing facility. To reflect this, the company name is changed to RSCC Aerospace & Defense, reflecting our roots and the specific types of products manufactured. This change also retains traceability back to RSCC as the original qualified manufacturer of these types of products.

2016 – Company name change to Marmon Aerospace & Defense along with new logo and a significant investment in the NH facility to add capability and capacity; reaffirming our commitment to the military market.
