Format - Webinar, in person

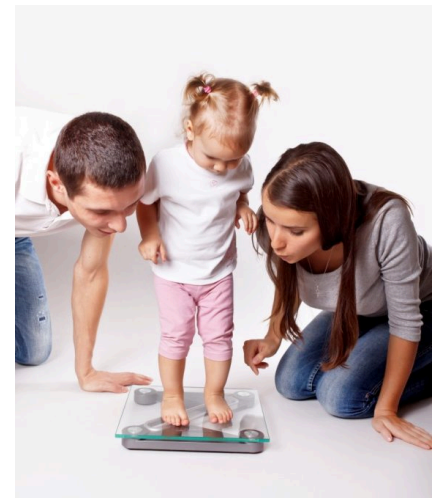
Wellness Without the Scale

S.O.S. - Strengths Oust Stress...Promoting Wellbeing at Home

Ideal audience - Adults who work with youth, peers, employees, law enforcement, teachers, faith leaders, teachers, coaches, or any community members

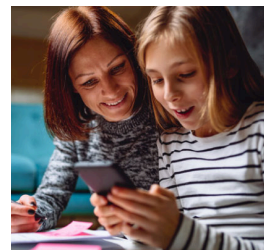
Internet Stranger Danger

Topic - How students can identify acts of cyber bullying and who are virtual strangers. Participants will also learn to identify private information and what is appropriate to share on the internet. At the end of the workshop participants will be able to identify supports and when to ask for help. (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 45 min

Ideal audience - PreK-K Daycare setting

Format - Interactive, in person



Talk Straight about Social Media

Topic - Discuss signs of Cyberbullying and how to confront/report it. Students will identify oversharing behaviors and ways to improve privacy setting online. Students also identify and describe the risks of popular social media challenges. (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 30-60 minutes

Ideal audience - Middle & High School, School Staff, Parents/Caregivers, Grandparents

Suicide Prevention



Suicide Prevention: Talk Saves Lives

Topic - To raise awareness, reduce stigma, and start conversations about suicide prevention. A one-hour introduction to suicide prevention, covering the scope of the problem, risk factors and warning signs, and what can be done to prevent it.

Duration - 1 hr

Ideal audience - school staff, staff at community based organizations, caregivers, teens

Format - In-person, virtual



ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training)

Topic - To build confidence and skills in having life-saving conversations and providing timely intervention. ASIST is a two-day interactive workshop that teaches participants how to recognize when someone may be at risk of suicide and how to help them create a plan to stay safe.

Purpose: To build confidence and skills in having life-saving conversations and providing timely intervention.

Duration - 2 days

Ideal audience - Mental health professionals, first responders, law enforcement, educators, community members

Format - In-person



safeTALK

Topic - To empower everyday individuals to be proactive in preventing suicide in their communities. safeTALK prepares participants to identify signs of suicide and connect the person to life-saving help. It focuses on alertness and referral skills—not counseling.

Duration - 3.5 hours

Ideal audience - Anyone 15 years and older

Format - In-person



Physical Health



My Sparkly Teeth, so Squeaky So Clean

Topic - Designed for elementary age students this series will discuss the fundamentals of oral hygiene as well as basic anatomy of the teeth. Through interactive games and activities the students will gain awareness of the basic of taking of their teeth. At the end of the workshop students will be able to demonstrate the ability to brush their teeth for 2 minutes (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 20 minutes

Ideal audience - Pre-K-Kindergarten Daycare setting

Format - Interactive, in person

Protecting Tiny Teeth

Topic - Designed for parents this workshop will explain why children should visit their dentist on a regular basis. Participants will be able to describe the benefits that fluoride has on teeth. Towards the end of the workshop parents will be able to apply at least two healthy behaviors to their child's oral health routine(Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 50 minutes

Ideal audience - Parents of 3-7 year olds

Format - Webinar, in person



Handwashing

Topic - Participants will gain a basic understanding of hand washing and define what are germs. Through interactive games and activities the participants will learn how to properly wash their hands. By the end of the workshop participants will able to demonstrate the steps of hand washing, when to wash hands and how germs can affect the body. (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 40 minutes

Ideal audience - PreK-4th Grade Daycare. School

Format - Interactive, in person



Get Active

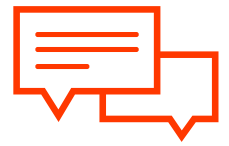
Topic - This workshop is to promote physical activity and discuss the importance of being active through interactive games and activities. Participants will able to list two benefits of physical activity. Participants will also be able to identify ways to be more physically active as well as demonstrate moderate intensity exercise routines. (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 45 minutes

Ideal audience - K-2nd grade, Afterschool

Format - Interactive, in person

Physical Health



Summer Safety

Topic - This workshop will discuss the basic fundamentals of sun exposure, pool safety, and traffic safety. Through interactive games activities participants will be able to demonstrate safe pedestrian behavior, as well as demonstrate safe pool activities. At the end of workshop participants will be able to state two safety tips about playing outside in the summer season. (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 45 min

Ideal audience - Pre-K-Kindergarten Daycare setting

Format - Interactive, in person



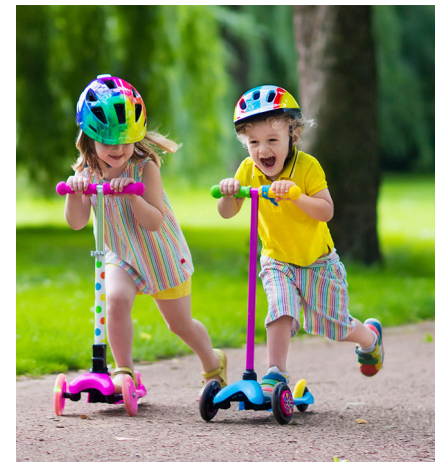
Bicycle Safety

Topic - In this workshop students will learn the importance of wearing a bicycle helmet and safety strategies to reduce the risk of injuries. Students will learn the five rules of bicycle safety and correctly identify traffic signs. Students will identify unsafe cycling situations and choose appropriate ways to reduce or eliminate risks that contributes to the safety of self or others. By the end of the lesson, students will be able to identify three important elements of wearing a bicycle helmet as measure (Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 20 minutes

Ideal audience - Middle School

Format - Interactive, in person



Yummy Eats

Topic - Participants will learn how to recognize if a food item is an appropriate and healthy snack, as well as identify the correct food groups of various food items. Also will be able recognize the importance of eating a variety of food groups throughout each day. By the end of the series, participants will be able to recognize healthy snacks versus less ideal snack foods through interactive games and activities.(Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 40 minutes

Ideal audience - Pre-K-Kindergarten Daycare setting

Format - In-person, Webinar





The Importance of Effective, Integrative Relapse Prevention Planning

Topic - Participants will learn about the importance of an effective relapse prevention plan that intergrates an holistic approach with a special focus on how to effectively write up smar goals and identification of formal and informal supports. (Professional Development or Community Awareness-Education)

Duration - 1 hr

Ideal audience - Substance Treatment Providers, Certified Peer Recovery Specialists OR persons in recovery

Format - Webinar, in person * Spanish available

Effective Engagement Strategies for Prevention and Early Intervention

Topic - The workshop highlights the benefits of appropriate utilization of engagement techniques, including techniques from motivational interviewing and the nurtured heart approach, in order to effectively detect and address substance use issues in youth. The workshop will also introduce the Wraparound Model of Care, which is a holistic approach that includes a focus on family and community engagement to “wrap” around a youth can be utilized with youth at risk of substance use disorders. Attendees will walk away with a toolbox of engagement strategies to promote substance use prevention and early intervention with youth.

Duration - 1 hr - 1.5 hrs

Ideal audience -Student Assistance Counselors, School Resource Officers, Juvenile Officers,
