It takes character to recognize the value of something up close. I don't know where I heard that many years ago, but I never forgot it. It's so easy to admire, to praise, and to have even deep appreciation for something or someone that you don't know close up. So many times, if we aren't focused on the right things, we will miss the fullness of today's blessing until later on. Then, looking back, we see that we had something precious and squandered it. There's an old song (by Bill Gaither) that says "We have this moment today. Don't wait for tomorrow to look back and wish for this day."

Sometimes, people have a great Pastor, but because they are "close up" and can see the thin spots, or some flaw (no one is perfect, you know), they fail to realize how wonderful it really was to have that person as their Pastor until it's over and too late to express appreciation as they should. But, this is true for many other persons and things. Sometimes, a man (or woman) has a spouse that is more precious than anything or anyone they ever knew, someone who was godly and who made life magnificent, but it doesn't dawn on them what they had until that person is gone. That could be said for a ministry.
