

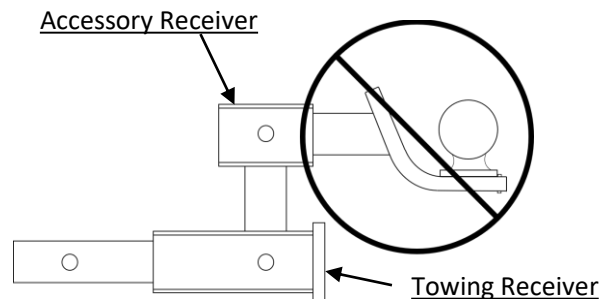

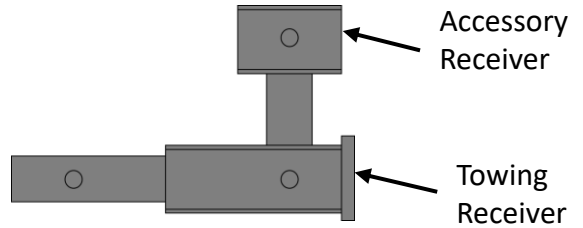
- Read and follow all instructions and safety messages before using the Dual Hitch Extension.
- Inspect for signs of wear, rust and damage before each use, if damaged, DO NOT USE.
- Never tow using the accessory receiver. Only use the accessory receiver for non towing accessories (e.g. bike racks, cargo trays). The Dual Hitch Extension should be installed with the accessory receiver in the top or upright position.



- Do not exceed a gross trailer weight of 4,000 lb or a combined total tongue weight of 400 lb. The combined tongue weight includes the trailer tongue weight plus the total loaded weight of the accessories.
- Do not exceed your vehicle manufacturer's recommended towing capacity. Consult the owners manual of your vehicle.
- Do not use with weight distribution system.
- Do not attempt to cut, weld or modify in any way the Dual Hitch Extension.
- Do not use more than one extension
- Inspect your vehicle and trailer connections at each stop and before each use.

Installation Instructions

- ⚠ NEVER tow using the accessory receiver. Only use this receiver for non-towing accessories such as bike racks and cargo trays. The Dual Hitch Extension should be installed with the accessory receiver in the top or upper most position.



- ⚠ DO NOT EXCEED a gross trailer weight of 4,000 lb or a combined total tongue weight of 400lb. The combined tongue weight includes the addition of the trailer tongue weight plus the total loaded accessory weight.
- ⚠ DO NOT exceed your vehicle manufacturer's recommended towing capacity. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.
- ⚠ DO NOT use more than one extension

No tools are required for the installation of the Dual Hitch Extension,

When installing the Dual Hitch Extension, check to ensure there is sufficient clearance between the tow vehicle, tongue, ground and/or any other mounted accessories while the vehicle is stationary or that may occur when driving. The Dual Hitch Extension must be installed with the Accessory receiver in the uppermost top position. A ball mount bar used in the rise position with the Dual Hitch Extension may cause interference. If this is the case, do not use the Dual Hitch Extension.

Check for interference once installation and loading is complete.

While Towing
