

Copy of Multi-view images

Vendors can choose to provide multiple images for each combination of product style and color. These images are then stored in an AWS bucket, and are retrieved by the ItemDetails page.

The standard format for multi-view images is

```
<style><delimiter><color><delimiter><unique part of filename>
```

The default delimiter is an underscore, so for the style ABC in Black you might have the following files:

```
ABC_BLK_BACK.JPG  
ABC_BLK_FRONT.JPG  
ABC_BLK_LEFT.JPG  
ABC_BLK_RIGHT.JPG
```

The style/color delimiter should be either a dash or an underscore. If you want to use a different delimiter check with the development team first.

You can also have a multi-view image that with a name that is only made up of the style, delimiter and color. For the above example the file name would be

```
ABC_BLK.JPG
```

In most cases this file name will be the one you use for single-view display, e.g. on the product browse. But because the multi-view images are in their own views folder it doesn't have to be the same file even if it has the same name.

Display Order

Files are returned in UTF-8 binary order. For a full list of character order see [Unicode/UTF-8-character table](#)

Because the sort order is by character it is case sensitive, and upper case characters come before lower case characters. To avoid unexpected problems you should ensure that all filenames use a consistent character case.

If you have an image without a unique identifier (e.g. ABC_BLK.JPG in the example above) that image will be the first one shown.
